## Rueden Sponsors County's 268th Barn Quilt

Joan Rueden has sponsored Shawano County's 268<sup>th</sup> barn quilt for the barn on a farm she owns at W1237 Highway 156, Pulaski. The pattern she chose is called Tulips and was selected because Joan has always liked flowers. "It's a very pretty pattern and really stands out," Joan said.

The quilt is actually the fourth one Rueden has sponsored as part of the county wide project started four years ago. The first is on a barn at W4774 County BE and the other two on a barn where Joan lives at W3156 Highway 156, Pulaski. "I really like them all," Rueden said. "They add a lot to our beautiful Shawano County countryside."

The farm where the latest quilt is displayed was homesteaded in 1875 by N.C. Foster. There were several owners over the years and the farm was a dairy farm for many of those years. The quilt was painted by the Shawano County barn quilt committee and was put on display by Bruce Teetzen and Jerry Timm of Raddant Electric in Shawano.
