

## Caesar's Crown is County's 233<sup>rd</sup> Barn Quilt

Jeff Kann and his wife, Terry Trickle, have sponsored Shawano County's 233<sup>rd</sup> barn quilt. The pattern, called Caesar's Crown, is on display on their barn at N911 Lawn Road, Seymour. The quilt was actually a birthday gift from Terry for Jeff's 60<sup>th</sup> birthday, so she let him pick out the pattern and the colors to have it painted in. "We really liked seeing the quilts as they were put up around the county," Jeff said, "so we thought one would look nice on our barn too. And with the price being so reasonable, it was an easy decision to get one."

Jeff and Terry have lived on the farm since 2007, moving there from Appleton. The barn is over 100 years old and was built by German immigrants. The steel roof was put on the barn sometime in the 1940s. It was always a dairy barn but now is used to store motorcycles for Jeff's motorcycle parts business. He ships parts all over the world, mostly through ebay or through his Web site.

In addition to his motorcycle parts business, Jeff plays guitar in two bands, mainly on weekends. Terry works in Appleton for Outagamie County.

The barn quilt was painted by the Shawano County barn quilt committee and was put on display by LeRoy Raddant and Bruce Teetzen of Raddant Electric in Shawano.
