

Angelica 4-H Club sponsors 38th barn quilt

The 22-member Angelica 4-H club has sponsored Shawano County's 38th barn quilt. The pattern, called "Garden Square," was painted by members and leaders of the club, appropriately in two shades of green on a white background.

The quilt is mounted on a shed owned by Jim and Kathy Brown at W2054 State Highway 29 near Angelica. The shed was built in 1973 as a machine shed on the family farm where Jim grew up. The farm was operated by Jim's parents, Clarence and Carol, until Jim and Kathy purchased it in 1993.

The original farmhouse was taken down when the new Highway 29 was built, leaving just the shed, which is now used for storage and a repair shop for Jim's business, Brown's Farm Service LLC.

The Brown family is very active in the Angelica 4-H club, with Jim and Kathy serving as co-leaders, son Benjamin as president and daughter Abby vice president.
